


The purpose of John's ministry



Six Liars

- 1. If we say that we have fellowship with Him, and walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. (1 John 1:6)
- 2. If we say that we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us. (1 John 1:10)
- 3. He who says, "I know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him. (1 John 2:4)
- 4. Who is a liar but he who denies that Jesus is the Christ? He is antichrist who denies the Father and the Son. (1 John 2:22)
- 5. If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen? (1 John 4:20)
- 6. He who believes in the Son of God has the witness in himself; he who does not believe God has made Him a liar, because he has not believed the testimony that God has given of His Son. (1 John 5:10)

Three Simple Tests

- To expose those who are false.
- To assure those who are genuine.

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



- Paul's epistles, and all the other epistles, are Church epistles; but this is a family epistle. It may prove more important to the individual believer than all the Church epistles!
- It takes the child of God into the fellowship of the Father's home.
- 1 John has been called the sanctum sanctorum of the New Testament.
- Life is real. It is a battleground, not a playground.
- If a person is wrong about Jesus Christ, he is wrong about God;
- If wrong about God, he is wrong about everything else.



What Was Heard, Seen, Touched and Studied



- 1 That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon, and our hands have handled, concerning the Word of life—
- the life was manifested, and we have seen, and bear witness, and declare to you that eternal life which was with the Father and was manifested to us—
- that which we have seen and heard we declare to you, that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship *is* with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ.
- ⁴ And these things we write to you that your joy may be full.

John was writing to share the Jesus Christ he knew.

He wrote to tell people how to be sure they have really been born of God.

He had five purposes for sharing:

1. That we may have fellowship (v. 3).


2. That we may have joy (v. 4).

3. That we may not sin (2:1).

4. That we may not be deceived

(2:26).

5. That we may know we are saved (5:13).

AND IN HIM IS NO DARKNESS AT ALL


Three Professions of Faith







PARABLES SERVE THE DUAL PURPOSE OF REVEALING AND CONCEALING: PRESENTING "THE MYSTERIES OF THE KINGDOM" TO THOSE WHO KNOW AND RELISH THEM. BUT TO THOSE WHO ARE INSENSIBLE TO SPIRITUAL THINGS OR SEE THEM AS MERE ALLEGORY, PARABLES ARE BUT TEMPORARY ENTERTAINMENT, IF THAT.

Why all the misunderstandings today?

Classical Greek is very complex.

I for example, there are both nouns and verbs that take forms in Classical Greek that English has no equivalents for.


- Thus, some Greek words require at least a phrase to convey the meaning.
- Alas, most translations take the easy way out and simply assign the "closest" English word.

What's the main difference?

Greek doesn't always work the way English does. For example:

- English: verb tense mainly is past, present or future.
- Greek verbs have seven tenses, not just three. They can also refer to <u>time of action</u> and also the <u>type of action</u>.
 - Present tense continuous (or progressive) action.
 - Aorist tense simple occurrence (like past tense)
 - Imperfect tense action that happened continually or repeatedly in the past.
 - Perfect tense action completed but results are ongoing.
 - Future tense anticipated or certain future happening.
 - Plus 2 more rarely used in the New Testament.

- Of course, Greek grammar really isn't so simple.
- Every Greek verb has four aspects besides tense, including person (1st, 2nd, 3rd); number (singular, plural); voice; and mood. Each verb changes form to define these aspects.\
- But fortunately we're not here to learn Greek!

- So let's just focus on why the grammatical differences can adversely affect our Bible understanding.



Two of the main culprits

Present Tense (continuous ongoing action)

The continuous present can be expressed as "I am ____ing" or "I am continuing to ____."

"Behold, I stand at the door and knock..." (Rev. 3:20)

Perfect Tense (a.k.a. present progressive tense)

The perfect tense expresses perfective action. Perfective action involves a present state which has resulted from a past action. The present state is a continuing state or a finished product; the past action is a completed action.

Pilate answered, "That which I have written, I have written." (Jn 19:22)



The Test of Knowing Him

- Now by this we know that we know Him, if we keep His commandments.
 - ⁴ He who says, "I know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him.
- ⁵ But whoever keeps His word, truly the love of God is perfected in him. By this we know that we are in Him.
- ⁶ He who says he abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as He walked.

Do you know Him?

Brethren, I write no new commandment to you, but an old commandment which you have had from the beginning. The old commandment is the word which you heard from the beginning.

And Jesus answered him, The first of all the commandments is, Hear, O Israel; The Lord our God is one Lord: And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these. (Mark 12:29-31)

Again, a new commandment I write to you, which thing is true in Him and in you, because the darkness is passing away, and the true light is already shining.

A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another. (John 13:34,35)

How is this commandment "new"?

Greeks had two different words for "new":

- 1) νέος neos, "new in time" (the latest model);
- 2) καίνος, kainos, "new in quality"; radically different;
 (English "recent" and "fresh" are rough equivalents).

The commandment to "love one another" is not new in time, but it is new in character. In Christ it now takes on a new meaning in 1 John 2:7-11:

- new emphasis (1 John 2:7)
 - new example (1 John 2:8)
 - new experience (1 John 2:9-11)

- ⁹ He who says he is in the light, and hates his brother, is in darkness until now.
- ¹⁰ He who loves his brother abides in the light, and there is no cause for stumbling in him.
 - ¹¹ But he who hates his brother is in darkness and walks in darkness, and does not know where he is going, because the darkness has blinded his eyes.



Their Spiritual State

- ¹² I write to you, little children (Τεκνία, "my little born again ones"), because your sins are forgiven you for His name's sake.
- ¹³ I write to you, fathers, because you have known Him *who is* from the beginning.
 - I write to you, young men, because you have overcome the wicked one.
 - I write to you, little children (παίδίον, "infants in the LORD"), because you have known the Father.
- ¹⁴ I have written to you, fathers, because you have known Him *who is* from the beginning.
 - I have written to you, young men, because you are strong, and the word of God abides in you, and you have overcome the wicked one.

Four types of address

- 1. Little children (τεκνίον, "my little born again ones"; "bairn ones").

 All Christians who have been born into God's family through faith in Christ.
- Fathers (πατήρ pater). Mature believers with an intimate personal knowledge of God—they know the dangers of the world.
- 3. Young men (νεανίσκος *neaniskos*) Adolescents; here, conquerors: they have overcome the evil one through the Word of God. Not yet fully mature; but on their way.
- 4. Little children ($\pi\alpha i\delta iov$, "infants in the LORD") carries the idea of immature ones, still under authority of teachers and tutors.

All are born again, but some have grown out of infancy into adulthood.

Do Not Love the World


- ¹⁵ Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.
- ¹⁶ For all that *is* in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life—is not of the Father but is of the world.
- ¹⁷ And the world is passing away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides forever.

Why Christians should not love "the world":

- 1. because of what the world is (a spiritual system opposed to God; see 1 John 5:19);
- 2. because of what a Christian is (1 John 2:12-14);
- 3. because of what the world does to us (1 John 2:15-16);
- 4. because of where the world is going (1 John 2:17).

Deceptions of the Last Hour

¹⁸ Little children, it is the last hour; and as you have heard that the antichrist is coming, even now many antichrists have come, by which we know that it is the last hour.



Who or what is the "antichrist"?

- a spirit that is in the world that opposes or denies Christ;
- 2. the false teachers who embody this spirit;
- 3. a specific leader—a satanic superman—who will head up the final world rebellion against Christ.

The prefix "anti" can mean (a) against and/or (b) instead of.

Characteristics of a false teacher:

- 1. Departs from the Fellowship (vv. 18, 19);
- Denies the Faith (vv. 20-25; & 4:1-6);
- 3. Tries to Deceive the Faithful (vv. 26-29).

- ¹⁹ They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would have continued with us; but *they went out* that they might be made manifest, that none of them were of us.
- ²⁰ But you have an anointing from the Holy One, and you know all things.
- ²¹ I have not written to you because you do not know the truth, but because you know it, and that no lie is of the truth.


CAUTION

- Who is a liar but he who denies that Jesus is the Christ?
 He is antichrist who denies the Father and the Son.
- ²³ Whoever denies the Son does not have the Father either; he who acknowledges the Son has the Father also.

Let Truth Abide in You

²⁴ Therefore let that abide in you which you heard from the beginning. If what you heard from the beginning abides in you, you also will abide in the Son and in the Father.

²⁵ And this is the promise that He has promised us—eternal life.



- ²⁶ These things I have written to you concerning those who *try to* deceive [*seduce*] you.
- ²⁷ But the anointing which you have received from Him abides in you, and you do not need that anyone teach you; but as the same anointing teaches you concerning all things, and is true, and is not a lie, and just as it has taught you, you will abide in Him.

The Children of God

- ²⁸ And now, little children, abide in Him, that when He appears, we may have confidence and not be ashamed before Him at His coming.
- ²⁹ If you know that He is righteous, you know that everyone who practices righteousness is born of Him.
