



#### **David**


- David made many mistakes and committed many crimes like adultery and murder.

Since Solomon is dealing exclusively with what he sees "under the sun" (i.e., the Creation"), he consistently uses *Elohim*.

**Defining the problem** 

- Vanity of vanities, all is vanity.
- That which has been is what will be, that which is done is what will be done, and there is nothing new under the sun.
- But we all forget the past.
- So is life under the sun really meaningless?
- Solomon applied his heart to know wisdom, but it was not easy. Much wisdom brings much sorrow.



- Solomon asked whether wealth brings satisfaction.
- The richest man in the world tested **enjoyment** by trying every kind of pleasure; wine, women, song, mirth, all that money can buy. Nothing satisfied.
- He then tested employment, building mega-structures and gardens and becoming even richer and more powerful, and increasing his worries.
- All was meaningless! The wise die like the foolish.
- All we can do is enjoy life while we can. To the person who pleases him, God gives wisdom, knowledge and happiness.



- NO! Life under the sun is not worth living:
- the monotony of life (1:4-11)
- the vanity of wisdom (1:12-18)
- the futility of wealth (2:1-11)
- the certainty of death (2:12-23)



Issue 1: The monotony of life

- To everything there is a season, a time for every purpose under heaven:
  - A time to live, and a time to die.
  - A time to mourn, and a time to dance.
  - A time to love, a time to hate.
  - A time of war, and a time of peace.

- It is the gift of God that man should find pleasure in his work.
- For who can bring them to see what will happen after them?

# MONOTONY

- I saw the tears of the oppressed, who have no comforter under the sun.
- Two have a good reward for their toil. And a three-fold cord is not soon broken.
- I saw everyone follow a new king, yet those who come later will not rejoice in him. Meaningless!
- I declared that the dead, who had already died, are happier than the living, who are still alive.





Issue 2: The futility of wealth

- Do not make rash vows before God. Better not to vow than to vow and not pay.
- The lover of money never has enough. They will take nothing away by hand at the end of their days.
- Eat and drink and enjoy the good of your labor under the sun all the days God has given you.
- Wise seldom reflect on the days of their life, because God keeps them busy with the joy of his heart.

## FUTILE MEALTH

- Here is an evil: to have wealth and honour but not to enjoy them.
- What do the wise gain over fools? Better the sight of the eyes than the wandering of desire.
- The more the words, the less the meaning, and how does that profit anyone?
- Many things increase vanity. How does that help?
- Who can tell a man what will happen after him under the sun?

Issue 3: The vanity of wisdom

- A good name is far better than vast wealth.
- The heart of the wise is in the house of mourning.
- Sorrow is better than laughter, because we can learn from it.
- Search out wisdom and the reason of things to know the wickedness of foolishness and folly.
- Do not be too righteous, or too wicked.
- God made man upright but they seek many schemes.





Issue 4: The certainty of death

# The last enemy - death Meet Your Last Enemy



- Death comes to all under the sun.
- The living have hope; a living dog is better than a dead lion.
- Wisdom is better than strength or weapons or folly.
- Man does know know his time, death will fall suddenly, so enjoy the days of your ephemeral life.
- The same fate come to all .... But God's "fate for us" should not be measured by just what happens under the sun. Christians measure it by what Jesus did at the cross.


### CERTAINLDEATH

- Because of laziness buildings decay and roofs leak.







The answer to whether live is worth living comes from one's perspective (or worldview).


- Life under the sun, from Man's perspective, is not.

#### **Solomon's Ten Vanities**

- 1. Human wisdom wise and fools come to the same end, <u>death</u>.
- 2. Human labour workers fare no better than shirkers in the end
- **3. Human purpose** man proposes, God disposes
- 4. **Human rivalry** success brings more envy than joy
- 5. Human avarice much feeds lust for more; never satisfied
- **6. Human fame** brief, uncertain, soon forgotten
- 7. Human in satiety money does not satisfy, feeds other passions
- **8. Human coveting** gain cannot be enjoyed, despite desire
- 9. Human frivolity it only camouflages inevitable sad end
- **10. Human rewards** good and bad often get the wrong deserts
